\$1,400 Raised For Summer Service Project

Forty one bright eyed loyal Notre Dame fans departed at 5:30 am on Nov. 7th to travel to South Bend to watch the Notre Dame vs. Navy game. They were rewarded with an exciting ND victory, 27-24. D.J. Fitzpatrick kicked a game winning 40 yd. field goal as time ran out. Although 9 empty seats kept us from reaching our financial contribution goal, these fans still helped the bus trip earn \$1400 to support our Notre Dame students at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Mother Teresa's Sisters of Charity. The students, the charities and the Club thank all the bus trip participants.

These 41 loyal fans will be rewarded. They are first in line for our Club tickets to the 2004 game versus Tennessee at Knoxville.
